FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear members and friends,

During this year I have been asked the same question many times. How is it possible that SRUK has become what it is today in such a short time? The answer is simple: passion and hard work of many people and the conviction of what we want to achieve, a Society that brings together Spanish researchers in the UK to give them a united voice that impacts society, influences science policy and closes the gap between researchers in the UK and Spain.

I have had the great pleasure of chairing the Society of Spanish Researchers in the UK during the celebration of its 5th Anniversary. This is an occasion to celebrate years of intense and pioneering work, and we were delighted to have been recognized with the **Innovative Institution Award 2016** from the Innovative Companies Forum (FEI). Nevertheless we should not forget that we are facing new and constant challenges to consolidate SRUK as a Society with a long-term projection that was conceived entirely by researchers and for researchers.

I would like to take this opportunity to highlight the main achievements we have accomplished thorough the year and that you will find in this Annual Report:

- Our network has reached **700 members** in **8 constituencies across the UK.**
- We have organized more than 50 events, including our Annual Symposium, seminars of the V Anniversary series, professional development workshops, outreach events and socials. As in previous years, we were also in Madrid with the CienciaUK.
- A brand new website has been launched to provide further professional and networking utilities to members and collaborators.
- More members have seen their work recognized and encouraged through the 4th call of our **Travel Grants**, the 2nd edition of the **Emerging Talent Award** and the 1st **Young Basque Investigator Award**.
- We have worked to establish **new international collaborations** with Spanish public institutions and learned societies such as **CSIC, CRUE, ASEICA or SEBBM.**
- With the results of our **Brexit Survey**, we have reached 9 British and Spanish learned societies and institutions, and have held meetings with the Royal Society of Biology, Universities UK and British Council to dialogue on how to influence the post-Brexit scenario.
- We have met with the 4 main **parliamentary groups in Spain** to follow up on the Report for Recommendations for R&D.
- SRUK has participated in more than 10 interviews, written 4 opinion articles, and in more than 100 times the press has echoed our events and opinions. We are a respected reference for journalists and readers.

- Our presence in **social media** has risen to more than 4,700 Facebook, 2,000 Twitter and 700 LinkedIn followers.
- A total of **22 bi-weekly newsletters have been sent** to our members, with a brand new format and sections, such as the Brexit Watch.
- Our members have communicated their research through 25 new posts in the SRUK Blog 1,2,3... Explore! and 10 new radio programs "En Fase Experimental".
- To promote the Women in Science debate, we launched the twitter campaign "#YoSoyCientificaCERU" (*I am a SRUK Scientist*), organized 3 Women in Science events and published the "SRUK Women's Project" report with the results of the "Women in Research Survey".
- In September 2016, our SRUK Mentoring Program came to light with 22 mentor, mentee pairs. The excellence of 6 mentors has been rewarded with a Mentor Recognition Award.
- **The Target Networks** initiative has begun its first project with the Junior Group Leader Network.
- We have raised £80k from 4 private and 2 public institutions.

And the most important of all, <u>more than 150 members have volun-</u> teered to make this possible!

It has been a frenetic and fruitful year and I have been extremely lucky to share it with an incredible team of 16 directors, including our vicepresident, Estrella Luna Díez. We have worked together with the various departments and committees to continue the mission and successes of the previous board chaired by Eduardo Oliver.

In addition, I would like to thank our sponsors and collaborators, specially the Ramón Areces Foundation who has reiterated its commitment by supporting an even more ambitious programme of events this year. The Banco Santander Foundation, Bizkaia Talent, Telefonica Foundation, the Spanish Embassy in London, the Spanish Foundation for Science and Technology and NIMgenetics, all have made our ambitions possible.

Finally, I do not want to forget those who committed at different times during these 5 years to build this Society, especially to the first group of researchers who conceived the objectives of SRUK, and with Lorenzo Melchor heading them while he was a researcher at the Institute of Cancer Research. I wish that those who met at the first assembly in June 2012 be satisfied with what they inspired.

Personally, I feel extremely happy to have contributed to this great adventure during these 5 years and I am really grateful for the opportunity to have represented this amazing community during 2016/17. I am certain that the Society will be in the best possible hands, with a new board of directors fully committed to make SRUK the Society we all want.

WHAT IS SRUK AND WHAT ARE OUR AIMS?

The Society of Spanish Researchers in the United Kingdom (SRUK) is an independent, non-profit organization. We do not have any political affiliation.

SRUK was created in July 2011 and was formally established in June 2012. At that time, SRUK was registered in the Company's House of England and Wales.

The Society was created with four main aims:



SOCIAL NETWORK

To create a social network of researchers and students working in the United Kingdom. We aim to facilitate the arrival of the new members, offer advice, and share professional and life experiences.

2

SCIENCE COMMUNICATORS

To increase public awareness of every aspect of the Research and Innovation (R&I) system. We aim to close the existing gap between researchers and the general public by holding seminars, roundtables, conferences and the Society's annual symposium.

3

SCIENCE REPRESENTATIVES

To be the representatives of the Spanish researchers in the United Kingdom for British and Spanish organizations, general public and the media. We aim to serve as scientific advisors for both public and private organizations. We believe that our knowledge and experience are relevant and worth sharing.

SCIENCE MEDIATORS

To facilitate collaborations between both private and public British and Spanish R&I institutions. It is our opinion that exploring and establishing collaboration between the UK and Spain will bear fruit in the long run.

¿ QUÉ ES CERU Y CUÁLES SON NUESTROS OBJETIVOS?

La Sociedad de Científicos Españoles en Reino Unido (CERU) es una organización independiente sin ánimo de lucro y sin afiliación política. Se creó en julio del 2011 y se constituyó de manera oficial en junio del 2012. La sociedad persigue cuatro objetivos principales:

- 1. Crear una red social de investigadores que trabajan en el Reino Unido
- 2. Acercar la ciencia al público en general
- 3. Ser los portavoces de los científicos españoles en Reino Unido ante instituciones británicas y españolas, medios de comunicación y redes sociales
- 4. Facilitar colaboraciones entre organizaciones relacionadas con la I+D+i del Reino Unido y de España, tanto públicas como privadas

OUR STRUCTURE

SRUK is run by volunteers. During 2016/2017, more than 150 members have actively participated in departments, committees and working groups, which have made possible the Society, as it is today.

As in previous years, we have grown, achieved goals and consolidated ourselves as a key "player" Society within Spain and the UK.

SRUK is managed by the executive committee that forms the Board of Directors, which is elected during the Annual General Assembly. The Board is formed by 17 members representing SRUK members, pursuing the aims of the Society and delineating the strategic plan for the coming years. In addition, SRUK is organized in eight Regional Constituencies across the UK and the directors of these constituencies are also part of the Board. This facilitates the direct communication between members and the Board.

Many volunteers are part of working groups and committees. Each constituency has a **Local Working Group** to shape regional activities and events. SRUK also runs with four departments: International Collaborations, Science Policy, Press and Online. In addition, **SRUK Committees** work to achieve specific goals of the society. Currently, SRUK has 5 committees: Fellowships, Scientific, International Symposium, Awards and Mentoring.

ESTRUCTURA DE CERU

La Sociedad funciona gracias al trabajo de más de 150 voluntarios y voluntarias que hacen posible la consolidación y crecimiento de CERU. Cada año la Asamblea General elige la Junta Directiva, encargada de representar a los socios, desarrollar los objetivos de la sociedad y delinear le plan estratégico de ésta. CERU se divide en ocho Delegaciones Regionales que facilitan la comunicación entre los miembros y entre estos y la Junta Directiva, y que cuenta con una Directiva Local y un Grupo de Trabajo. Así mismo, existen departamentos y comités específicos para trabajar en objetivos específicos.




OUR MEMBERS

During 2016/2017, the SPC has continued promoting the development of efficient and competitive science policies both in Spain and in the UK. It has also been working towards dealing with the uncertainty of Brexit.

Initiatives in Spain

We have focused in promoting the **R&I recommendations report** that SRUK published in September 2015 for the Spanish general elections. After the new Government was established, in October 2016, we initiated working relationships with all R&I representatives of the major political groups in the Spanish Parliament. We have encouraged discussion regarding avenues for collaboration and have renewed attention to the recommendations published in our report.

With the objective of promoting SRUK recommendations in R&I during the current legislature, we have written opinion articles and featured in several leading papers. Fidel Alfaro Almagro and Emma Martínez wrote **'Señor Presidente, ¿para cuándo la ciencia?'** published in *Hipertextual* to highlight the absence of a Science Ministry in the structure of the new Spanish government. They also wrote **'Tiempo de pactos en ciencia'** (published in El Pais) where they reviewed the science policy pledges shared among main political groups during the past electoral campaign and encouraged those groups to collaborate for the benefit of Spain. The SPC also evaluated the electoral science policy pledges of all political parties during the 2015 electoral campaign. The resulting report, entitled 'Análisis del contenido en política científica de los programas electorales' seeks to identify consensual measures that with more possibilities of being successfully implemented in Spain.

EL COMITÉ DE POLÍTICA CIENTÍFICA (CPC)

El CPC de CERU se ha centrado en reactivar el interés en España por su 'Informe de recomendaciones sobre la I+D'. El CPC se ha reunido con los representantes en materia de ciencia de los diferentes grupos parlamentarios en el congreso y ha publicado diversos artículos de opinión. En el Reino Unido, el CPC ha liderado la encuesta sobre los posibles efectos del Brexit en nuestros miembros. En base a la encuesta, se publicó una declaración proponiendo las principales medidas para salvaguardar el sistema de I+D+i en el país y haciendo un llamamiento a la colaboración entre las distintas organizaciones. Como resultado, nos hemos reunido con la Royal Society of Biology, el British Council y con Universities UK, para apoyar a la comunidad científica internacional durante el proceso del Brexit.


Annual Report 2017

Initiatives in the UK

On the 23rd June 2016, 51.9% of the British population voted in favour of the UK leaving the European Union. The result of the referendum was unexpected and has prompted a lot of uncertainty among British and EU citizens and scientists.

Science relies on collaboration networks, facilities and subsidies strongly supported by Europe, the SPC led the survey **'The Impact of Brexit in SRUK members'** to know members' views on the potential impact of Brexit in their lives in the UK. From this exercise, SRUK prepared the statement **'A Brexit that works for all'** to communicate the main findings of the survey, to propose four measures to palliate the effects of Brexit and to call for collaboration with other stakeholders. Also, Fidel Alfaro Almagro wrote an opinion article **'Qué será de los científicos españoles con el Brexit'** (published in El Independiente) forecasting the options for Spanish scientists in the UK after Brexit. The publication of the survey and statement prompted interesting collaborations with British and Spanish organisations.

We have met with the Royal Society of Biology, the British Council and Universities UK to strengthen the evidence on the EU membership benefits for R&I systems and to foster bilateral agreements to support the R&I system in the UK and other EU countries. Moreover, on June 27th, SRUK attended this year's Parliamentary Links Day with the theme of "UK Science and Global Opportunities".

INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIONS SRUK aims to bridge the collaboration gap between Spain and the UK enhancing the scientific success of both R&I systems.

To achieve this goal, agreements will focus on two key aspects:

- To provide a collaboration platform that will enhance visibility of research groups and raise awareness of potential partners (through a shared database and networking events between SRUK and Spanish institutions).
- 2. To facilitate bi-directional mobility of researchers in order to improve career development and attract talent to Spain.

Partnerships and Collaborations:

During the last couple of years, SRUK have signed different agreements with Spanish institutions (**Red de Universidades Valencianas por el fomento de la I+D, Fundación Instituto de Investigación Sanitaria de Aragón** and **Instituto de Investigaciones Biomédicas de Málaga**. Since last July, when the Department of International Collaborations was officially established, new agreements have been reached leading to different activities:

Consejo Superior de Investigaciones Científicas (Spanish National Research Council - CSIC). In May 2017 a networking event to stimulate **Collaboration and Mobility in Research** was held in the Spanish National Biotechnology Centre (CNB, Madrid).

Conferencia de Rectores de las Universidades Españolas (Conference of Chancellors of Spanish Universities - CRUE). The main aim of this agreement is to **facilitate bi-directional mobility** of researchers between UK and Spanish Universities.

Asociación Española de Investigación sobre el Cáncer (Spanish Association of Cancer Research - ASEICA). Our agreement with ASEICA enhances visibility and promotes networking of research groups between Spain and the UK. We also collaborate with Sociedad Española de Bioquimica y Biologia Molecular (Spanish Society of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology– SEBBM) and SRUK members will enjoy a reduced registration fee in their annual conference.

We are currently in touch with different Spanish organizations to develop further collaborations and in the future we hope to launch our programme **"SRUK On the Move"** providing bidirectional mobility fellowships between the UK and Spain.

DEPARTAMENTO DE RELACIONES INTERNACIONALES

CERU tiene como un objetivo fundacional ser intermediario de la Ciencia, para ello ha buscado y busca establecer acuerdos con instituciones científicas españolas. Estos convenios quieren estimular colaboraciones entre España y Reino Unido que ayuden a atraer fondos internacionales y que promuevan la movilidad entre ambos países. Hasta el momento CERU ha firmado acuerdos con la Red de Universidades Valencianas por el fomento de la I+D (RUVID), la Fundación Instituto de Investigación Sanitaria de Aragón (IIS Aragón), el Instituto de Investigaciones Biomédicas de Málaga (IBIMA), el Consejo Superior de Investigaciones Científicas (CSIC), la Conferencia de Rectores de las Universidades Españolas (CRUE) y la Asociación Española de Investigación sobre el Cáncer (ASEICA).

INDUSTRY COLLABORATIONS

Contacts with technological companies and spin-offs: Opening doors to collaborations with industry.

So far, SRUK is collaborating with NIM Genetics and Mind the Byte. They are leaders in their fields with strong R&I departments and SRUK members benefit from webinars provided on recent technological advances and further opportunities for contact with them. SRUK is open to explore mutually beneficial collaborations with other companies too.

Communicating science to society

The Press Office is formed by an enthusiastic team of volunteers, with researchers and journalists working together to improve the visibility of SRUK. The SRUK Press Office serves as a link between SRUK researchers, constituencies and departments, the media and the public. We are the main point of contact for journalists at local, national and international level.

In the last year we have issued 14 press releases covering different SRUK activities. Activities such as the SRUK Annual Symposium or the SRUK V Anniversary Seminars Series. Initiatives as the SRUK Emerging Talent Award, the SRUK Travel Grants, Women in Science and the result of the SRUK "Brexit Survey", received interest from the media. From the Press Office, we also monitor and analyse media coverage related to SRUK initiatives.



Researchers Go Public

To raise social awareness about science and research, we aim to communicate and disseminate the research of our more than 700 members. With this purpose, we are in contact with the media to facilitate the presence of SRUK researchers and their achievements in Spanish media. In addition, as part of the SRUK outreach programme, the Press Office is in charge of producing the radio program "En Fase Experimental", and the SRUK blog 1,2,3... Explore! The third season of our fortnightly radio programme includes the latest scientific news, future events and members' interviews, serving as the perfect platform to reach and inspire the general public. Likewise, the SRUK Blog 1,2,3... Explore! launched a year ago, aims to promote the public dissemination of the research made by SRUK members. It has already received more than 10,000 visitors during this year. Since June 2016, our posts, written both in Spanish and in English, have covered diverse topics: from the Zika virus to the evolution of galaxies, from anthropology to the most innovative technologies. Our blog cover image, designed by Diego Alonso, reflects SRUK multidisciplinarity.

The Press Office aims to potentiate the visibility of SRUK not only in the Spanish but in British media, and to build a solid communication strategy for SRUK in collaboration with the Online and Communication Department. In addition, we have an ongoing collaboration with the College of Communication Sciences at the University Jaume I in Castellón (Spain), to promote SRUK corporative identity and a strategic communication plan.

In April 2017, for the 4th consecutive year, SRUK awarded eight members a travel grant to help support the cost of presenting their research at conferences all over the world. To improve the career prospects of our more junior members, we decided to restrict the call to members that do not hold a permanent position. 36 applications were received and evaluated by the SRUK scientific committee on the basis of the applicant's CV, a lay abstract describing their work, and the expected benefit to the applicant from attending the conference.

TARGET NETWORK

CIENCIA UK 2016

This year, SRUK returned to Madrid in November to provide young researchers and students with a view of the professional opportunities in science that the UK offers. In "CienciaUK 2016", SRUK gathered together more than 200 people in the Ramón Areces Foundation. Talks from 12 speakers gave insightful examples of the research career paths in the UK, both in academia and in other sciencerelated jobs, covering a wide range of case studies: from working in industry to science policy or from business development to science diplomacy. This event, which has now been celebrated in Madrid for 3 consecutive years, will continue to bring innovative approaches to foster professional development of Spanish young researchers.



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

SRUK WOMEN'S PROJECT 2017

This year we wanted to join the international community to commemorate women's efforts towards gender equality. With this aim and to examine researchers' experiences and perceptions of gender equality we launched the **'Women in Research Survey'**. The results of this survey,



led by our secretary Rocio Gaudioso, were published in the 'SRUK Women's Project: A Pathway towards gender equality' where we also featured five of our members in our series of personal and professional profiles. We also published Nerea Irigoyen's (SRUK Director of International Collaborations) article entitled 'Ateneas científicas para derrumbar el techo de cristal' in *Materia*.



Some constituencies did not want to miss the opportunity to join and commemorate the 'International Day of Women and Girls in Science' with inspirational talks and seminars by leading women scientist.

Finally, the SRUK membership joined together under the #YoSoyCientificaCERU hashtag to share and communicate their research with the community.

EL PROGRAMA DE MENTORING

SRUK is aware of the challenges that most Spanish researchers will face when developing their research career in the United Kingdom. Therefore, we have designed a **mentoring scheme** to help and support them to maximize their opportunities and plan a successful career path. **The SRUK Mentoring Programme** benefits from the diverse range of members' skills and fields of expertise, as well as from their previous working experience in the British, Spanish and other international systems.

The Programme started in August 2016 with 36 registered mentors and 22 mentees, all regular or associate members of SRUK. The SRUK mentoring committee performed the matching of 22 mentor-mentee pairs according to their research area and expertise, as well as development needs and career ambitions of the mentee. Mentors and mentees meet at least **once every two months** and these meetings provide support, discuss progress, identify targets and help create plans of action. Mentoring relationship lasts for one year but they can also be renewed.

The SRUK Mentoring Programme have also offered free professional training for mentees (September 2016) and mentors (October 2016) in a webinar format. These training courses covered relevant issues on mentor and mentee benefits, what a mentor should and shouldn't do, how to reflect mentee sessions and other important information such as some guidelines and codes of practice. Also, to facilitate a face-to-face meeting between mentor and mentee, SRUK has offered **Travel awards** covering the mentee or mentor's travelling expenses.

SRUK also wants to recognize the effort and the relevant role of mentors in this Programme. Therefore, at the end of this first year, mentees have been asked to whether they want to nominate their mentors for a **Recognition Award** that rewards mentors that have offered an outstanding performance. We have rewarded 6 members with this Recognition Award.

The first edition of the SRUK Mentoring Programme has been a complete success, which has encouraged us to work on the new edition that will kick off in September 2017, stay tuned for updates!

Recognising and fostering Spanish talent in the UK

Currently, SRUK has 3 awards that acknowledge the outstanding work of researchers at different stages of their career. In 2017, we launched the second edition of the Emerging Talent Award and the first edition of the SRUK Young Basque Investigator Award with the support of Fundación Banco Santander and Bizkaia Talent, respectively. We also run the biannual SRUK Lifetime Achievement Award recognising long-standing research trajectories.

This year, SRUK in collaboration with Bizkaia: talent has launched the first edition of the "SRUK/Bizkaia: talent Young Basque Investigator Award". This award aims to recognize and support the professional career of a young Spanish researcher linked to the Basque Autonomous Region who carries out their research activity in the United Kingdom.

This award is **sponsored by Bizkaia: talent** and is framed within their line of action involving the recognition of the international professional career of highly-qualified young Basques, giving young scientists the opportunity to do research in the most innovative areas of the sector through fellowships and special programmes.

There are **three awards**, one of $5,000 \in$ and two of $1,000 \in$, to cover any aspect which helps to develop the research career of the winner.

The awardees will be announced during the award ceremony that will be held in Bilbao September 2017 during the Science+ meeting.





We are very pleased to have renewed the support of Fundación Banco Santander, under its "Young Talent" programme, to launch the second edition of the SRUK Emerging Talent Award. The aim of this award is to recognise and support a promising young Spanish researcher who has developed their career in the UK.

The prize consists of £14,000 to be invested for the development of the awardee's career, such as research-related tasks, dissemination of recent results, specialised training or family arrangements. This award also seeks to increase the visibility of the winner's research to both British and Spanish societies.

Dr. Xavier Moya is the 2017 SRUK Emerging Talent Award

Dr. Xavier Moya's outstanding research has made ground breaking contributions to his field, Materials Science, and to the development of new eco-friendly alternatives to current cooling systems.

Xavier worked from 2008 to 2012 at the Department of Materials Science & Metallurgy, University of Cambridge, before spending nearly one year as a Ramón y Cajal Fellow at the University of Barcelona. He then returned to Cambridge on 1 October 2013 as a Royal Society University Research Fellow.

Since then, Xavier has started a new research programme on mechanocaloric materials for environment-friendly energyefficient refrigeration applications, where small changes in applied stress yield large changes in temperature. For this, he has set up an EPSRC-funded (UK) thermal-imaging facility, and an ERC Starting Grant-funded (European Commission) state-of-theart high-pressure calorimeter facility.

Xavier's work on functional materials has led to a number of breakthrough results that have been published in high-impact journals, and that have been presented in numerous invited talks at international conferences and workshops. He currently have 70 publications that have been cited over 4680 times.

Xavier will use the prize to build a breakthrough experimental system that will allow him and his team to measure the caloric effects of new materials used in cooling systems. This system will be the first of its kind in the world and will allow the study of new materials with potential commercial applications.

Annual Report 2017

Very high-calibre applications were received again this year and were assessed by the designated evaluation panel. Based on their evaluations, the awardee was decided by a jury composed by representatives of SRUK, the Emerging Talent Award evaluation panel, the Banco Santander Foundation, the Ramón Areces Foundation, the Spanish Foundation for Science and Technology (FECYT), and the Office of Cultural and Scientific Affairs of the Embassy of Spain in the United Kingdom.

One more year, we got together to share our work with other members in our Annual International Symposium

The IV International Symposium SRUK was held in London on the 9th and 10th July 2016 and it welcomed more than 130 scientists.

On the Saturday session, the symposium hosted Prof. Alfonso Martínez-Arias, Ms. Carmen Vela and Prof. Stephen Curry as keynote speakers. Prof. Martínez Arias presentation, entitled "The Pyrenees, the Channel and the Ocean (notes on Spanish science from a small island)", gave an overview on the science in the UK and Spain from his experience after having lived in the UK for more than 30 years. Ms. Vela introduced the Spanish system of Science and Innovation and the different actions and programs that are being developed to improve the country's research system. Prof. Curry, with his talk "After the referendum: what's the best we can do for European science?" presented the current situation of British science after the EU referendum. The three speakers joined in a roundtable entitled "How much do Spain and the UK weight in the international scientific scale?", where they answered questions from the audience. The lively debate focused on how the current Spanish situation affects researchers abroad and what steps should be followed to improve it as well as Brexit. It was an excellent opportunity to have an insight on how political issues are deeply intertwined with the peculiarities of the Spanish research system.

The Saturday session finished with the best oral presentation prizes, awarded to Dr. Paz Vaqueiro and Dr. Ana Río, and the best poster presentation prize given to Samuel Wilkinson and Sam Paplauskas. We also hosted the Life Achievement Award ceremony, where Prof. Martínez-Arias' scientific career was celebrated and recognised.

Plans 2017/2018

One of our main future goals is to engage with more researchers across the Midlands that are keen on joining us. In addition, we also want to develop new **outreaching activities** that will allow us to communicate our work, not only to the scientific community but also to the general public. To do this, we are planning a **workshop in presentation skills** in the autumn. The Midlands constituency was re-established after the III International Symposium SRUK, and re-structured soon afterwards. Currently, The Midlands constituency encompasses eleven cities and involves more than 25 members. Its dynamic working group is working hard to organise several social and scientific events throughout the year.

Events 2016/2017




ECONOMIC REPORT


