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FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear members and friends of SRUK/CERU,

It is a real pleasure to introduce our new Annual Report 2021-2022. Once again, our Design committee have exceeded our expectations; what a magnificent piece of work we have on our hands! Not to mention the work of all of you, our members and volunteers that make SRUK/CERU possible every year. All our volunteers work with such passion and dedication in their departments and committees to deliver our activities to implement the vision and the aims of our Society. Together, we make an amazing team, and each year we learn a bit more and take SRUK/CERU one step further. There are not enough words to express our gratitude and admiration for all of you that have worked so hard this year.

2021 will always be remembered as part of the Covid19 pandemic. As you know, the impossibility of meeting in person deeply affected the modus operandi of SRUK/CERU, which had always been based on networking and making new friends. Fortunately, from summer 2022 onwards we were able to resume our in-person meetings, always complying with the restrictions imposed at the time by the government. Happily, this allowed us to celebrate one of our biggest milestones as a society: **the 10th Anniversary of the official establishment of SRUK/CERU**, and therefore our birthday. A series of events, most of them in-person, were held across the UK starting in January 2022. We were also able to meet again in Oxford for our **IX SRUK/CERU International Symposium, "The Joy of Discovery"**, a multidisciplinary symposium chaired by Dr Pablo Muñoz that highlighted the process of discovering and unraveling new phenomena. During this symposium we also had a very special session where almost all our ex-presidents shared their experiences and stories whilst being in role and discussed how the Society has contributed to their lives and careers.

This year we have operated with fewer volunteers due to the combined effects of Brexit and Covid19. However, despite the circumstances we have managed to organise a total of 55 events! Moreover, we warmly welcomed our most recent constituency in the North East, established for the first time in our Society's history! This leads us once again to congratulate the amazing work that all our volunteers do, even during these tough times.

Both Javier and I hope you find these pages interesting and enjoy reading the summary of what has been a great year for SRUK/CERU. Personally, we would like to highlight:

- The magnificent work that the science policy department has done regarding **Brexit**. We ran a new Brexit survey among our members which revealed the UK as a less appealing country to live, work and study. Conversations with the Spanish Foundation for Science and Technology (FECYT) are being held to fight against the loss of appeal of the UK among the Spanish researchers.
- Since December 2021, we hold the vice-presidency of the network of Spanish researchers abroad (RAICEX) and have contributed as science representatives and advisors to the revision of the **new Spanish law for Science, Technology, and Innovation**, by compiling and sending to the Spanish Ministry our suggestions to improve the conditions of the researchers in Spain. Some of these suggestions were accepted. Similarly, we also contributed to the publication of the "ATRAE" report, a decalogue of proposals to facilitate the return of Spanish researchers from abroad.
- With our **3**rd edition of the SRUK/CERU On the move program we have continued supporting the mobility and collaboration between researchers in both Spain and the UK. We also continued with our **Winter and Summer Studentships** that awards 3-month UK placements for Spanish undergraduate students. We also awarded series of **Travel Grants** to selected SRUK/CERU members to cover part of their expenses to present their research at international conferences.
- We have maintained our commitment to recognise the research excellence and contribute to their development with our **Emerging Talent Award 2022** sponsored by Fundación Banco Santander. As a result of

the postponed events during the pandemic, we held the award ceremony of the Emerging Talent Award 2021 in May 2022. The ceremony of the Emerging Talent Award 2022 and the postponed Emerging Talent Award 2020 will be held together in November 2022. The award ceremonies always take place in the Spanish Embassy in London.

- We are also extremely proud of the publication of our **Science-me a story book**. This bilingual book aimed at children is formed by stories from the first three editions. This book was published with Penguin and all the contests are sponsored by Fundación Lilly.
- Two special prizes were also given during this year to recognised researchers. The **ACES-Margarita Salas Award** organised by our sister Society ACES was granted to Prof. Mercedes Maroto, candidate nominated by SRUK/CERU. And Prof. Carmen Galán was awarded the **Merit Award**, the highest honour awarded in our Society.
- We kept raising awareness of the role of women in research through empowering seminars and events organised by our Wom=n Equity & Research committee. Traditionally, part of these events is aimed to commemorate the International Day of Girls and Women in Science (11 Feb), and the International Women's Day (8 Mar) among others.
- During the AGM 2022 we discussed how to ensure the sustainability of the Society, and we created and approved with this aim 4 new departments: Public Engagement & Outreach, Territorial, Diversity, Equity and Welfare, and Professional Development.

José Javier Burgos Mármol presided during the first part of the year (from July 2021 to February 2022), leaving for personal reasons, with Claudia Román-Montañana assuming the position of interim President for the second half of the term (February 2022- July 2022). Last but not least, we would like to acknowledge the help of Carmen Sánchez-Cañizares, SRUK/CERU ex-president and Director of Institutional Relations, for her invaluable help, time and advice.

We wish SRUK/CERU a happy birthday, another 10 years, maybe even 100.

WHAT IS SRUK/CERU? WHAT ARE OUR AIMS?

The Society of Spanish Reearchers in the United Kingdom (SRUK/CERU) is a non-profit, independent organization. We do not have any political affiliation.

SRUK/CERU was created in July 2011 and was formally established in June 2012. At that time, SRUK/CERU was registered in the Companies House of England and Wales. The Society was created with four main aims:

1. SOCIAL NETWORK

To create a social network of researchers and students working in the United Kingdom. We aim to facilitate the arrival of the new members, offer advice, and share professional and life experiences.

2. SCIENCE COMMUNICATORS

To increase public awareness of every aspect of the Research and Innovation (R&I) system. We aim to close the existing gap between researchers and the general public by holding seminars, roundtables, conferences and the Society's annual symposium.

3. SCIENCE REPRESENTATIVES

To be the representatives of the Spanish researchers in the United Kingdom for British and Spanish organisations, general public, and the media. We aim to serve as scientific advisors for both public and private organisations. We believe that our knowledge and experience are relevant and worth sharing.

4. SCIENCE MEDIATORS

To facilitate collaborations between both private and public British and Spanish R&I institutions. It is our opinion that exploring and establishing collaboration between the UK and Spain will bear fruit in the long run.

¿QUÉ ES CERU Y CUÁLES SON NUESTROS OBJETIVOS?

La sociedad de Científicos Españoles en Reino Unido (CERU) es una organización independiente sin ánimo de lucro y sin afiliación política. Se creó en 2011 y se constituyó de manera oficial en junio de 2012. La sociedad persigue cuatro objetivos principales:

- 1. Crear una red social de investigadores que trabajan en el Reino Unido.
- 2. Acercar la ciencia y la investigación al público en general.
- 3. Ser los portavoces de los investigadores españoles en Reino Unido ante instituciones británicas y españolas, medios de comunicación y redes sociales.
- 4. Facilitar colaboraciones entre organizaciones relacionadas con la I+D+i del Reino Unido y de España, tanto públicas como privadas.

OUR STRUCTURE

SRUK/CERU is managed by the **Executive Committee** (EC), formed by 17 directors representing all our SRUK/CERU members and who work together to pursue the aims of the Society. The Directors of the different departments are elected during the Annual General Assembly. In addition, SRUK/CERU is organised in ten established Regional Constituencies across the UK, and the Directors of these constituencies are also part of the EC and elected by their local members. This facilitates the direct communication between our members and the EC. We also count with Ambassadors in Spain, who are our main link and represent our members there.

SRUK/CERU is run by volunteers. During 2021/2022 around 100 members have actively participated in our departments, working groups and committees, which is what makes possible the Society as it is today.

Many volunteers are part of our departments, working groups and committees. SRUK/CERU counts with five departments: Institutional Relations, International Collaborations, Science Policy, Press and Communications. Moreover, each constituency has a Local Working Group to shape their regional activities and events. In addition, SRUK/CERU committees work to achieve specific goals of the Society. Currently, SRUK/CERU has nine committees: Fellowships and Awards, Evaluation, International Symposium, Mentoring, Wom=en, equity and research, Cancer-ASEICA, Science-me a Story, En Foco and Design, together with the teams of the Blog, Radio, YouTube and Instagram, and the members of our Scientific Advisory Board.

As in previous years, we have grown, achieved goals, and consolidated ourselves as a key player within Spain and the UK. As always, we welcome any member interested in participating actively on board of our amazing team of volunteers.



ESTRUCTURA DE CERU

La Sociedad funciona gracias al trabajo de más de 100 voluntarios y voluntarias que hacen posible el crecimiento y la consolidación de CERU. El Comité Ejecutivo (CE) es el encargado de representar a los socios, desarrollar los objetivos de la Sociedad y delinear el plan estratégico de la misma. Cada año la Asamblea General elige a los miembros del Board, a los directores administrativos y a los de los departamentos. Además, CERU se divide en diez Delegaciones Regionales cuya Directiva Local, elegida a nivel regional, también forma parte del Comité Ejecutivo. Así se facilita la comunicación entre los socios y el Comité Ejecutivo. Los voluntarios de CERU participan en los grupos de trabajo de las delegaciones, en los departamentos y en los distintos comités, que desarrollan los objetivos específicos de la sociedad.


SRUK/CERU accommodates all research disciplines and career stages. Most of our academic members are in the "career consolidation stage", between being a PhD student and an independent group leader. We also count with members working in industry and in the public sector.

OUR MEMBERS

SRUK/CERU is consolidated as a network that reaches over 1200 persons through its regular means of communication. A fraction of this community encompasses our regular members, who are grouped in nine established constituencies across the UK and one in the process of being developed. We also have a number of Friend members in Spain and other countries and Associate members in the UK.

NUESTROS SOCIOS

La CERU es una red que, en el curso 2021-2022, ha conectado a más de 1200 personas. Una fracción de esta comunidad está constituida por nuestros miembros regulares, que se agrupan en nueve delegaciones oficiales y una en fase de constitución. CERU cuenta con tres tipos de miembors: socios regulares (investigadores españoles que trabajan en Reino Unido), socios asociados (no investigadores o no españoles que trabajan en Reino Unido) y amigos (fuera de Reino Unido), dando la bienvenida a todo el mundo interesado en formar parte de CERÚ.

SRUK/CERU X ANNIVERSARY

The X Anniversary of the official establishment of SRUK/CERU provided the perfect opportunity to celebrate the intense and pioneering work of its members with five special events selected to showcase the objectives of the Society and to reach the various intended audiences that benefit from the activities organised by its members. Additional funding was provided to enhance the visibility of the events, ensure free entry for all attendees and allow more members to travel from other parts of the UK.

A **Forum on Plant Biotechnology** (February 2022) organised in collaboration with the Embassy of Spain Office for Cultural and Scientific Affairs (OCSA) was delivered on-line to facilitate the participation of researchers and companies from both Spain and the UK. Cutting-edge and world-leading research performed in the most prestigious institutions in both countries raised awareness of the importance of plant biotechnology to provide solutions to the unavoidable challenges of food provision and climate change. The Forum allowed new collaborations between academics and companies working in the agricultural sector to develop and also fruitful discussions between academics, companies and policy-makers.

A Public Engagement event at the Instituto Cervantes in Manchester in April 2022 welcomed scientists, writers, teachers and the general audience to explore ways to use in education the book "Science-me-a-story. Stories for young researchers", a compilation of the 20 awarded stories (written in English and Spanish) of the first three editions of the Ciencia-me-un-cuento/Science-me-a-story contest (see pages 24-25). Run in collaboration with the Lilly Foundation, the contest has grown into a widely followed initiative that involves writers, science communicators and researchers from over 50 different countries, with a common goal: to transfer their passion of Science to children. Seventeen SRUK/CERU members worked hand-in-hand with the authors to bring colour and images to their stories resulting in a book that everyone can enjoy while learning about copepods, vaccines, cells and the scientific method.

A one-day mini-symposium entitled **Covid 19: the beginning, the journey and the future** was held in May 2022 at the Physical & Theoretical Chemistry Laboratory of the University of Oxford. The sponsors, which included The Biochemical Society, allowed the organisers to attract world-leading scientists in academia and industry who encompassed different aspects of the Covid-19 pandemic. This line-up attracted over 50 attendees, mostly graduate students and post-doctoral researchers from several disciplines. The presentations were followed by lively discussions which, as anticipated given the diverse and multidisciplinary profiles of the audience, led to challenging and interesting questions. The attendees learned about the biology of the coronavirus, life at an UCI ward, the innovation that led to a successful mass testing programme, upcoming innovative vaccines and the impact that the SARS-CoV-2 virus has on the brain. A lively networking took place during the lunch break prompting a myriad of new ideas.

The SRUK/CERU 10 years journey: a dialogue with former SRUK/CERU presidents: a session scheduled as part of the SRUK/CERU Annual Symposium in July 2022 in Oxford, to showcase the Society's journey, welcomed the eight former SRUK/CERU presidents who had completed a full term. Members had the opportunity to thank all of them for their leadership which has been crucial for the achievements of the Society in the past years. A lively dialogue between current members and former presidents followed and had the anticipated result of encouraging junior members to take up positions of responsibility to not only contribute to the development of the Society, but also to develop their own professional skill set.

The X Anniversary celebrations will feature its final event "Scientific Gatherings II - Northern Power", in Autumn. The North East and Scotland Constituencies are planning a mini-symposium to showcase the work of junior and senior scientists within the SRUK/CERU community and provide a networking opportunity for members of North East, Scotland, in particular, as well as for other SRUK/CERU members and the general public.

At SRUK/CERU, we have taken and continue to take an active role in defending the interests and rights of Spanish researchers both during the Brexit negotiations and beyond.


We also perform **impartial analyses and provide recommendations** to foster the Spanish R&D system, based on our perspective from within the British system. We have established a good working relationship with journalists, officials and politicians. This year, our work has been featured in Nature, El País, El Periódico de España, and El Ibérico, among other media.


In the UK

We continue to monitor the new regulations being rolled out in the UK that affect research and researchers, as well as their families and dependants. In this line, we published the results of a new survey on the impact of Brexit on Spanish researchers and students living in the UK. This survey revealed increased uncertainty and lower appeal of the UK compared to previous surveys and highlighted citizens' rights and access to European funding as prominent concerns of our community. To better understand this last point, we interviewed two SRUK/CERU members who were awarded a European Research Council (ERC) Starting Grant and were not able to accept this award due to the lack of an agreement regarding the participation of the UK in Horizon Europe.

We have also made available on our website **information regarding the different types of visas** that EU researchers coming to work or study in the UK might need. In addition, we have continued to assist Spanish researchers with questions related to immigration processes. During the next year, this information will be included in a second edition of the **"Guide of the"**

Spanish Researcher in the UK", which we are developing in collaboration with the Embassy of Spain in London and the Spanish Foundation for Science and Technology (FECYT).

In Spain

In the context of the 2021 Emerging Talent Award Ceremony, we held a meeting with the Spanish General Secretary for Research and the International Director of FECYT. During this meeting, we discussed how Brexit has impacted the community of Spanish researchers in the UK. We focused on how to enhance international mobility and bilateral collaborations, advocated for the inclusion of the UK in Horizon Europe, and discussed the difficulties faced by Spanish researchers in the UK when returning to Spain. Related to this last point, we have also been offering our community updates about procedures for accreditation with ANECA. We are in contact with the relevant entities and sought information about how protocols continue to change after Brexit.

Alongside the other societies of Spanish researchers abroad, grouped in RAICEX, we have contributed to several science policy documents:

- Briefing for the Spanish Ministry of Science and Innovation on the **fast-track route for homologation of academic titles** to promote the attraction of researchers working abroad.
- Briefing for the Spanish Ministry of Science and Innovation on how **tenure-track schemes** work in different countries.
- Feedback to the Spanish Ministry for Science and Innovation on the **modification of the Spanish Bill for Science, Technology and Innovation**. Some of the modifications we suggested and that were incorporated in the bill include the regulation of the double affiliation and the consideration of the research experience abroad towards the calculation of "sexenios de investigación".
- Article published in El País "Hacia un sistema de ciencia e innovación competitivo y atractivo a escala internacional" were we presented our views on the new Spanish Bill for Science, Technology and Innovation.
- ATRAE Report (Attraction of Talent and Return to Spain), a decalogue of proposals to facilitate the return of Spanish researchers from abroad. This report arises as a complementary action to the Return to Spain Plan approved in 2019 and some of the measures included in it have been implemented in the Plan de atracción y retención de talento científico e innovador approved by the Spanish government.

EL DEPARTAMENTO DE POLÍTICA CIENTÍFICA

Desde el Departamento de Política Científica de CERU, interaccionamos con distintos actores en España y Reino Unido para defender los intereses de los investigadores españoles en ambos países. Durante este año hemos publicado diferentes informes sobre temas relacionados con el Brexit y el ecosistema de I+D+i español. Además, hemos seguido reuniéndonos con actores políticos y medios de comunicación para hacerles conocedores de la situación de nuestra comunidad y nuestras propuestas.

Officially established in July 2018, the Red de Asociaciones de Científicos e Investigadores Españoles en el Exterior (RAICEX) currently represents 18 associations, which together account for more than 4,000 Spanish researchers and scientists abroad.

Our joint mission is to promote the exchange of experiences and knowledge between Spanish researchers abroad and all the agents of the Spanish System of Science, Technology and Innovation, serving as an advisory body, a channel of information, and a catalyst of international relations and multi-directional research, thus contributing to the progress of science and research. SRUK/CERU has an active role within RAICEX and has contributed to the following initiatives:

- In December 2021, the VI Meeting of Spanish Scientific, Technological and Innovation Diplomacy was held in Madrid, facilitated by FECYT and hosted by the Ramón Areces Foundation. Our President Javier Burgos attended this meeting representing SRUK/CERU. The new directors for 2022 were appointed, with SRUK/CERU holding the vice-presidency as our SRUK/CERU-RAICEX delegate and Director of Institutional Relations, Carmen Sánchez Cañizares.
- Our SRUK/CERU Ambassador in Spain, Eduardo Oliver, and the General Secretary of RAICEX, Eva Ortega Paíno, published an article entitled "The story of RAICEX as a successful scientific diaspora organization" (Frontiers, July 2022), highlighting the role of scientific diaspora in policies, processes and practices.
- Our Department of Science Policy has actively contributed to the different **policy initiatives** led by RAICEX to defend the interests of the Spanish researchers abroad in front of the Spanish R&D institutions (see p. 12-13).
- We participated in the **first edition of the Award ACES-Margarita Salas**, aiming to recognise the career of an established Spanish researcher working abroad. Our nominee, **Prof. Mercedes Maroto**, received this award in Stockholm in November 2021, presented by The King and Queen of Spain. In the 2022 edition we nominated **Dr. Ana Payo Payo** for her work in Environmental Sciences.
- Our members Prof. Mercedes Maroto (Feb 2022), Prof. Sonia Contera (May 2022), and Fernando Gomollón Bel (June 2022) have participated in the seminar series "Diálogos de Ciencia en Español" co-organised by RAICEX in collaboration with Ramón Areces Foundation, Consejería de Educación, Universidades, Ciencia y Portavocía de la Comunidad Autónoma de Madrid (CAM), Oficina del Español de la CAM, and Rafael del Pino Foundation.
- Our members have participated in **Punto de Enlace** radio interviews from **RTVE Radio Exterior**, featuring researchers working abroad, led by Eduardo Oliver and Eva Ortega Paíno. In July 2022, after our annual symposium, the SRUK/CERU 10th anniversary had its own special program with our SRUK/CERU president, Claudia Román, highlighting the role of SRUK/CERU as the first society to be established and its participation in RAICEX.

Diásporas of European Researchers in the UK

SRUK/CERU continues to foster our relationship with other associations of European researchers in the UK to explore the concerns and interests of our communities. These relationships are particularly important in the context of Brexit, as we believe that collaborating with other associations representing European diasporas in the UK makes our message of supporting international collaborations and international researchers stronger. This year we signed together the **#StickToScience campaign** calling for an open and inclusive European Research Area. Following our Brexit surveys, we also wrote a joint letter co-signed by all hosting organizations in Nature to make public our con-



cerns about the delays in signing the final agreement for association of the UK with EU research grammes (Brexit: delays worry diaspora researchers, Nature 604, 425 (2022)).

Societies of Spanish citizens in the UK

Together with our Department of Science Policy, SRUK/CERU

has participated in monthly meetings with groups of Spanish citizens in the UK to monitor the impact of Brexit in our communities and the changes in the mobility and immigration policy, as well as to give voice to our concerns. This year we highlight the informative event about the Global Talent Visa that SRUK/CERU co-organised with Coalición de Españoles en el Reino Unido and the joint announcement asking for more support in the face of Brexit challenges.

We communicate and negotiate with Spanish and British organisations (academic and non-academic), explore opportunities for interaction and generate agreements for collaboration; we collaborate and share knowledge with other Societies of Spanish Researchers around the world; and we manage a portfolio of Education, Awards, Networking and Mobility programmes. We focus on some key aspects:

- **International agreements.** We facilitate collaborations and increase visibility of both Spanish and British research groups.
- International mobility. We provide a connection platform and foster bidirectional mobility of researchers at different stages of their career.
- Career development. We organise workshops and seminars and we improve career prospects of both visitors and supervisors in our mobility grants.
- **Networking and Information.** We organise networking activities and informative events. We study how Brexit affects research mobility, and its implications for our programmes.

Our new and established collaborations allow the development of **SRUK/CERU initiatives**:

- International research mobility UK ↔ Spain. Manage mobility grants focused on training and collaborative placements for researchers at different stages of their careers.
- Talent recruitment and networking opportunities. Create and support forum events to connect British, Spanish and European researchers and research groups.
- **Professional development and awards.** Offer informative and training schemes that advise about alternative or complementary research pathways.

2021/2022 Highlighted programmes and events

- 3rd edition On the Move Fellowships: On the Move is a bi-directional mobility programme for research staff in Spain and in the UK in partnership with the Conference of Rectors of Spanish Universities (CRUE). This year, we awarded 7 placements both in Spain and in the UK out of 14 available opportunities.
- SRUK/CERU Winter and Summer Studentships: 32 students from three Universities in Spain have ensured a 3-months

placement with our Winter or Summer Studentship. Additionally, 20 SRUK/CERU members had the opportunity to supervise students, many of which repeat every year!

- Bringing back the Cancer Committee: We started a campaign to recruit Cancer Committee members and re-start or continue contacts with our collaborators CRIScáncer, ASEICA (Asociación Española de Investigación Sobre el Cáncer) etc.
- Post Brexit travel to the UK guide: We developed a useful guide for researchers or students who need to travel from Spain to the UK for a placement and made it available online. We have developed a further guide for the wider audience in collaboration with the Science Policy Department.

Future initiatives

• 2nd event on the SRUK/CERU Cancer Networking Series: This is a series of international symposiums to take place in the UK and Spain that aim to promote scientific discussion, networking and collaboration between UK, Germany and Spain-based cancer researchers and institutions. It will bring world-leading scientists in the fields of cancer genomics, immune system and paediatric cancer to the CNIO (Centro Nacional de Investigaciones Oncológicas), Madrid. The day will alternate seminars, networking, mentoring activities and roundtables on science policy and funding opportunities. Our supporters are Fundación Ramon Areces, ASEICA and Mission Bio and we collaborate with CNIO and CERFA (Científicos Españoles en la República Federal de Alemania).

Since June 2021, our department has issued a total of 15 press releases written by our team members and in collaboration with members of the SRUK/CERU Executive Committee.

This year, we have been extensively covering the issues the scientific community is currently facing in the UK. For instance, we have been warning the society about the difficulties that Spanish researchers in the UK have been facing since Brexit officially occurred with regards to keeping their right to study or work in the UK. We have also communicated how our Society is contributing to the "Stick to Science" project, which aims to guarantee that the UK, together with Switzerland, are part of Horizon Europe and can have access to grants to fund research in the UK.

Apart from news focused on science policy, we have also covered events in which SRUK/CERU has been involved in as well as the awards our Society delivers. Some of these press releases include the SRUK/CERU Emerging Talent Award, the publication of the Science-Me a Story book, or the Annual International Symposium our Society hosted in Oxford. More than 40 journals and newspapers have been disseminating our press releases in the media, making it possible for the wide audience to learn more about how SRUK/CERU is contributing to society.

As part of the SRUK/CERU outreach program, our department also coordinates the radio program "En Fase Experimental" and the "SRUK Blog/Blog CERU". Both initiatives publish their content on a monthly basis, covering the latest scientific news explained by both SRUK/CERU members and invited collaborators.





This year, "En Fase Experimental" has released 10 podcasts, which have been played more than 9,000 times, being the US, Belgium, Spain, the UK, and Germany the top 5 countries that have been following our radio program this year! Currently, "En Fase Experimental" can be followed not only on our Society's website but also on the main podcast platforms such as iVoox, iTunes, Spotify, and YouTube.

Our other initiative, the "SRUK Blog/Blog CERU", contributes to scientific outreach by publishing monthly posts about the up-to-date research that our SRUK/CERU members and collaborators carry out. This year, we have published 15 posts that have covered topics from everything and anything in science and research: biology, chemistry, new technologies, women in research, history... You name it! Our posts have been read between 2,000 and 9,000 times, so we are extremely thankful to all the bloggers that have collaborated with us this year, thanks to whom our "SRUK Blog/Blog CERU" can be up and running and enjoyed by many readers across the globe. In September 2022, we will reveal the 3 winners of our sixth edition of the annual SRUK/CERU Blog contest, so stay tuned in our social media to discover the posts that our readers have liked the most!

Given that information is currently transmitted mostly online, the Press Department has joined forces with the Online Department. In that way, both departments have been working closely together to develop and communicate SRUK/CERU activities in a clear, transparent, quick, and truthful manner to the society.

WITH A SCIENTIFIC TWIST

Inktober is a month-long art challenge that lives on Instagram and that is very popular within the illustrators' community. It consists of publishing an original illustration per day during October, each inspired by a given word.

With "Inktober with a Scientific Twist", we adhered to this initiative on SRUK/CERU Instagram, for the first time this year, in a very special way: first, organising a team of volunteers (members and not members of our Society) to complete the challenge collaboratively, and second, asking them to find a "scientific twist" to the official Inktober words. We also requested to add a little explanation to the image, to expand the meaning of the illustration.

Our initiative's main goals are to **raise awareness** about how scientific advancement and the wonders of nature are present in every aspect of life and to **encourage the use of visuals for scientific communication**. We are also willing to promote the values of collaboration, as we complete the challenge together, and to stimulate curiosity. And, of course, having fun.

We recruited a team of **10 volunteers** from different profiles, but most of them were working in areas related to life sciences. Some of the illustrations were used to communicate interesting facts about animals and plants, highlighting the importance of biodiversity conservation. Others delved into how life works, explaining physiology and structural and molecular biology. Chemistry and technology also had their place.

Although the task proved, in fact, challenging, given that illustration was not the volunteers' main activity, and it competed with other commitments, they expressed having had fun and learned a few things. We hope anyone following the challenge on our social media did too!

On 2021, we closed the **fourth edition** of **Science-me a Story.** After four years, the contest is very well established and it has a constant participation of around **150 contestants**. For the first time, we have introduced specific rules for the submission of **poems**. These have been accepted since the first edition of the contest. However, their increase in popularity made us realise that we needed to acknowledge them on both the submission rules and the judging panel guidelines.

Running the contest in two languages as extended as English and Spanish has made the initiative known worldwide. This year, we have received stories from Israel, Ireland, Nigeria, New Zealand and Japan, and we have seen a strong participation from the American countries as we have observed since the first edition. For that reason, we have increased the size of the judging panel of each category from four to six members. We wanted to reduce their workload so they could enjoy the contest. We are very grateful to all of them for their time and effort. While for some of them it was their first time, others have been collaborating with us since we launched the contest in 2017.

For this edition, the juries have mentioned the difficulty to choose the awarded and finalist stories. These have been written to portray Science, the scientific method or the life of a scientist in an accurate and fun way, suitable for primary school children. Summarising these features in a few pages is challenging, but the winners have excelled at it. We are very happy to present them here. They received £200, £150 and £100 for first, second and third prize respectively, a booklet with their stories and a diploma. As always, as part of the prize, their stories were published on the online version of **Principia Kids** (for the Spanish category) and the website of the **Literature and Science Hub** of the University of Liverpool for the English one.

This year, the winners of previous editions have read their stories in Science engagement activities, like at the Day of the Woman and Girl in Science organised by the Wom=N committee and at the SRUK/CERU Symposium. But, the highlight of 2021 has been the publication of the Science-me a Story bilingual book, a compilation of the awarded stories of the first three editions of the contest. We wanted the stories to get to children and to be used in classrooms to learn both Science and languages. The dream came true thanks to the sponsorship of Fundación Lilly and the editing of Penguin Random House. It contains the twenty stories beautifully illustrated by volunteers and the biographies of all the authors. The book is available for free through this QR code (view image). We have a few hardcopies that we are gifting to institutions, schools and other organisations with a Science engagement activity in mind.

In November, we presented it at the **Instituto Cervantes** in Madrid. The presentation, a recording of which is available on YouTube, consisted of a roundtable with **Laura Ibáñez-Tejero**, author of one of the stories; **Quique Royuela**, founder of Principia and Bárbara de Aymerich, writer of the prologue and it was chaired by **José Antonio Sacristán**, director of Fundación Lilly. They discussed how the **storytelling** can help children learn and how the Science-me a Story book is a **powerful teaching tool**. The public enjoyed the discussion on the first in-person activity after the pandemic. We are looking forward to expanding Science-me a Story on the next years.

In addition, this year, we organised the **"From images to science stories" workshop** in collaboration with Helena Gonzalez, director and co-founder of Big Van Science. The workshop aimed to improve research communication and languages skills to emphasise the beauty of the research. This workshop was the first of several related to public engagement and science designing.

In 2021, the Cambridge and North-West constituencies collaborated to organise the second edition of "Investigación en Foco", the SRUK/CERU photography competition.

Once again, the main objective was to allow SRUK/CERU members and friends to express and reinforce the **need and beauty of daily research through images**. An important part of the competition was to make the research more **accessible** to a broad audience.

Each participant was able to submit a single photograph to capture a particular theme in any research field, including Mathematics, Biology, Medicine and Health, Chemistry, Ecology and Environmental Science, Physics, Astronomy, Engineering Technology, Humanities, Arts, Social Sciences and Science Communication.



The 9th International SRUK/CERU Symposium took place in Oxford from Friday 1st to Sunday 3rd July. Titled The Joy of Discovery, the first SRUK/CERU in-person symposium since 2019 congregated over 100 SRUK/CERU members and friends for three days full of science and networking. This edition was also special because we commemorated SRUK/CERU's 10th anniversary.

On Friday evening, the opening ceremony was held at the gorgeous Oxford Town Hall. We were very fortunate to count with the participation, either in-person or online, of Inma Aguilar Nácher, Director of the Spanish Foundation for Science and Technology (FECYT); Raimundo Pérez-Hernández y Torra, Director of the Ramón Areces Foundation; Alistair Fitt, Vice-Chancellor of Oxford Brookes University; Miguel Oliveros Torres, Minister Counsellor for Cultural & Scientific Affairs at the Spanish Embassy in London; and our president, Claudia Román Montañana. The welcome speeches were followed by an extraordinary talk by guest speaker Marina Pérez de Arcos, Research Associate at the Centre for International Studies, University of Oxford, who talked about the Long and Winded Road that connects Oxford and Spain.

The Friday ceremony finished with a special session aimed at celebrating SRUK/CERU's 10th anniversary. This session started with a speech by **Carmen Sánchez-Cañizares**, RAICEX Vice-President, and a video of all RAICEX representatives celebrating SRUK/CERU's birthday. Finally, a touching roundtable conducted by **Cristina Delgado** brought together all former SRUK/CERU presidents, who conversed about the excitement and challenges of their term as presidents.

On Saturday and Sunday, the symposium moved to Oxford Brookes University and the fantastic John Henry Brookes lecture theatre. A particular aim of this symposium was to soften the division between science and the humanities, and thus the list of invited speakers included speakers from both worlds: Felipe Fernández-Armesto, Professor of History, classics and the History and Philosophy of Science at the University of Notre Dame; Margarita Díaz-Andreu, ICREA Research Professor at the University of Barcelona; Rebecca Bowler, STFC Ernest Rutherford Fellow at the University of Manchester, Francis Mojica, Professor of Microbiology at the University of Alicante; and Carmen Galán, Professor of Organic and Biological Chemistry at the University of Bristol and winner of the 2022 SRUK/CERU Merit Award

Among the other sessions that took place during the symposium, it is worth highlighting a roundtable on the Public perception of scientific discovery, which included **Ignacio López Goñi** (University of Navarra), **Beatriz Vigalondo García** (I.E.S. José Luis Sampedro, Tres Cantos, Madrid), **David Schley** (Sense

About Science) and **Fiona Lethbridge** (Science Media Centre). This session started with short talks by the invited speakers and a very dynamic exchange with the audience.

There was also time for SRUK/CERU members to present their research, both in formal talks and during a poster session on Saturday and Sunday. Furthermore, to contribute to their training and professional development, attendees could select among five different workshops that took place either online or in-person: Introduction to UKRI: UK Research and Innovation, by Rocío Gaudioso; ANECA: Learn about the platform and the accreditation process as a researcher in the UK, by Carmen Sánchez Cañizares; The joy of un-discovering: accessing multiple forms of knowledges, by Team Ventana; Avoiding unconscious bias, by Sonia Contera; and Is it game over? Gamification in Higher Education, by Isabel Murillo and David Wareing. All the workshops were engaging and highly valued by the attendees.

Finally, social activities included a formal banquet at **St. Edmund's Hall**, one of the oldest colleges in Oxford, and enjoyable museum and night city tours both on Friday and Saturday, kindly offered by members of SRUK/CERU Oxford working group. The 9th International SRUK/CERU Symposium was an enormous success. The talks and activities were of extraordinary quality and the number of attendees and their engagement throughout the symposium exceeded the organising committee's expectations. It was, on the whole, an excellent Symposium.

In February 2022, to promote the career development of its regular members, SRUK/CERU opened the 9th call of the SRUK/CERU **Travel Grants**. In this new call, applications were accepted for **international** research activities and events. Ten grants of up to £400 were available for this round. Twenty-four applications on diverse scientific areas were received. Due to the limited nature of the funding, grants were awarded on a **competitive basis**, based on merit and the expected impact of the meeting on the applicant's professional development and career. Among the members who fulfilled the mandatory requested criteria, SRUK/CERU awarded **ten members** a 2022 travel grant. These grants were aimed to help fund the cost of presenting their research outcomes at in person international conferences or specialised meetings.

Then, the SRUK/CERU Executive Committee shortlisted 3 candidates and all SRUK/CERU members voted for the winner of the SRUK/CERU Merit Award 2022 Carmen Galán, Professor of Organic and Biological Chemistry at the University of Bristol.

MERIT AWARD 2022

Prof. Carmen Galán

Prof. Galán is interested in **synthetic organic chemistry** and develops synthetic tools for biological and biomedical applications. She studied chemistry in **Universidad de Alicante** and did her **Ph.D. in Organic Chemistry** at the Complex Carbohydrate Research Centre at **The University of Georgia**, USA. Following two postdoctoral stints at the Scripps Research Institute

and MIT, she returned to the UK in October 2006. In 2008, she became a Royal Society Dorothy Hodgkin fellow and, from 2012 to 2017, she held an EPSRC Career Acceleration Fellowship, followed by an ERC consolidator award. Since August 2017, she holds the position of Professor in the School of Chemistry and Study Abroad Academic Director.

The awardee has also contributed to SRUK/CERU activities, initiatives, and founding objectives. Prof Galán has been a member of the Evaluation Committee of our SRUK/CERU Emerging Talent Award in two of its editions and she is always approachable and willing to help. She has a very international group, with Spanish researchers both as team members and visitors. She has obtained several international awards which highlight the excellence of her work, such as the RSC Dextra Carbohydrate Chemistry award in recognition of her research into new synthetic methodologies for oligosaccharide synthesis and the RSC Jeremy Knowles award for the development of bioinspired synthetic probes. She has also been the Editor-in-Chief of Carbohydrate Research since 2019.

The SRUK/CERU Merit Award is the highest honour awarded by our society. This biennial award was established in 2016 and recognises the career of a internationally renowned Spanish researcher based in the UK, with a significant contribution in their field of expertise and an impact on the wider society, while also having promoted scientific collaborations between Spain and the UK.

The SRUK/CERU Merit Award was announced during the IX International Symposium SRUK/CERU, event in which Prof Galán shared her joy for receiving the award and the latest results of her pioneering research on new synthetic methodologies for oligosaccharide synthesis and the development of novel glycoconjugate probes. In the words of the awardee, "I am very honoured and humbled to receive this fantastic award. What makes it particularly special is being recognised by a Spanish society created to support researchers like me who left Spain to develop our careers abroad. It has been quite a journey and I am very proud of being part of this society and for being offered a platform to the international Spanish community". With this recognition, Prof Galán has also been awarded an honorary membership of the Society and she will become a distinguished adviser for SRUK/CERU.



Dr Nuria Tapia Ruíz wins the 2022 SRUK/CERU Emerging Talent Award

Dr Nuria Tapia Ruíz received her PhD degree in Chemistry in 2013 from the University of Glasgow. She then worked as a postdoctoral researcher at the University of St. Andrews until 2014, when she moved to the University of Oxford. After one year of postdoctoral research, Nuria became a Na-ion battery team leader. After two years at Oxford University, she obtained a lectureship and became an independent principal investigator (PI) at the Chemistry Department at Lancaster University, and she

got promoted to Senior Lecturer in 2020. In September 2022, Nuria will start a new position as **Senior Lecturer** at the **Chemistry Department of Imperial College London**.

Her research focuses on developing materials for sustainable energy storage, which translate into technology solutions that contribute towards a rapid transition to renewable energy generation to fight global warming. In particular, low-cost and sustainable batteries. During these years, Nuria has developed an extensive track record in the area of sodium-ion batteries. which are a **sustainable alternative** to Li-ion batteries. She has contributed extensively to advancing knowledge in the area of layered oxide cathode materials. Nuria has also pioneered research on the **discovery of oxygen redox behaviour** of sodium layered oxide materials. The novelty of her approaches has been supported by numerous grants accounting for more than £3M. Nuria will use the award money for multiple purposes, such as organising a series of meetings and workshops in collaboration with Spanish research centres leading battery research, and technological centres specialised in battery scale-up and manufacturing. She expects to establish new collaborations and apply to joint research grants. The award will also cover travel expenses of Nuria's group members to these Institutions. To raise awareness in the general public and funding agencies of the importance of energy research to tackle climate change, Nuria will give talks at outreach events organised by SRUK/CERU and disseminate her work through general public journals and science magazines.

PREMIO TALENTO EMERGENTE 2022

La Dra Nuria Tapia Ruíz es la ganadora del Premio del Talento Emergente 2022. Nuria lidera un grupo de investigación en el Imperial College London, que se centra en el desarrollo de materiales para la acumulación sostenible de energía. Nuria empleará el dinero del premio (£14.000) para múltiples propósitos, como organizar una serie de reuniones y talleres en colaboración con centros de investigación españoles líderes en este campo de investigación y centros tecnológicos especializados en el escalado y la fabricación de baterías. Para concienciar sobre la importancia de la investigación energética para hacer frente al cambio climático, Nuria dará charlas en eventos organizados por CERU y difundirá su trabajo a través de revistas científicas y para el público general.



MENTORING PROGRAMME

Due to today's **competitive and unstable** research environment, success in building a career does not solely depend on a good track record. Lifelong **learning**, **upskilling**, **and reskilling** is vital for professional progression. In addition, **soft skills** like collaborating fruitfully, being a leader, and managing conflicts are key. Furthermore, most researchers face questions about which professional path to pursue. With the aim of meeting these needs, SRUK/CERU has offered its members a **Mentoring Programme** for the last 5 years, which has attracted participants with diverse skillsets and expertise.

The present edition of the **Mentoring Programme** started in April 2021 with **68 participants**. The mentors guided the mentees towards goals identified by the mentees themselves to improve their **professional development**. Three **surveys** along the one-year programme (at 2, 6 and 12 months), where mentors and mentees were asked to review their relationship, have allowed us to monitor the programme, and to resolve any issues. Like previous editions, the 2021 programme has been an **overwhelming success**, with increasing satisfaction scores, as shown in the figure below.

The **Mentoring Committee** has offered a free and mandatory training for mentors and mentees in the form of a webinar to make the mentoring relationship more dynamic and productive. To facilitate face-to-face meetings between mentor and mentee, SRUK/CERU also provided Travel awards covering the mentee or mentor's travel expenses. Based on feedback from previous editions, an online Mentoring Café session was also spearheaded by the Mentoring Committee. In this initiative, mentors had the opportunity to share their concerns and to bounce ideas off other mentors' experiences. Furthermore, in this edition, the SRUK/CERU Mentoring Programme has also offered a successful training on Project Management, developed by three experts: Sandra Navarro, co-founder and CSO at Flat 101; Dr. Itziar Peñafiel, R&D&I Project Leader at INIBICA; and Dr. Julio Ríos, Head of Innovation & Technology Transfer at INIBICA



Raise awareness of the role of women in research

Our committee is part of the **Women's committee of RAICEX**. In collaboration, we submitted an abstract to the 11th European **Conference on Gender Equality in Higher Education** in September 2021. The positive feedback has encouraged us to write a **book** to show gender differences and progress towards reaching equality in Academia across thirteen countries. The UK chapter has been written by the Chair of our committee. The book will be **published by the end of 2022**.

In collaboration with **RAICEX** and **ECUSA**, our committee organised a seminar to discuss the **Equality in Academia** through three different perspectives: Research (lead by **Dr Marta Macho**), Journalism (**Patricia Fernández de Lis**) and Law (**Dr Soledad Murillo**). The seminar was held on the 27th September 2022 and was streamed via Youtube. Our Chair has been interviewed by RNE as a consequence of this event.

Promotion of women's professional development

We prepared a round of **empowering talks** for women in Science in autumn 2021. These monthly talks explored the **challenges** of women in Academia, the difficulties of being a female researcher and a mother and we gave tips to women to be successful in **job interviews**. Due to their success, we are planning to carry them forward.

Day of Woman and Girl in Science. 11th February

We have successfully given talks to promote Science, Higher Education studies and careers in STEM among Spanish high and primary-school students.

Research in Education

The success of the "Awakening vocations" project in Spain has encouraged us to develop this project in the UK. We will summarise and compare the results obtained in both countries. We would like to analyse whether the cultural background of students plays a significant role in the biases of girls to pursue careers in the STEM field.

MUJERES EN INVESTIGACIÓN Y EQUIDAD

Nuestro objetivo es despertar conciencia sobre los retos a los que se enfrenta la mujer investigadora a lo largo de su carrera académica y brindar estrategias para su desarrollo profesional. Organizamos regularmente charlas en las que tratamos estos temas. También estamos determinadas a acercar la ciencia a las generaciones más tempranas, bien sea a través de charlas organizadas por el Día de la Mujer y la Niña en la Ciencia, 11F, o a través de la puesta en marcha de la segunda edición de Despertando Vocaciones donde queremos comparar el impacto lingüístico en los roles de género en ciencia.

Annual Report 2022

Events 2021/2022

This year's activities were greatly influenced by the Covid-19 and the intermittent lift of restrictions. After months of online events, our main aim was to connect in-person again, in order to promote networking and wellbeing.

In July, we celebrated our first in-person gathering since the beginning of the pandemic; we met at the iconic Hampstead Heath park for a joyful and sunny **Summer picnic.**

During Autumn, while our **annual assembly** remained online, our **Welcome Party** took place outdoors and brought together members from different corners within the Constituency, some of whom had arrived during the pandemic. Shortly after, we paid a **cultural visit to two distinctive engineering landmarks** in London: the Thames Barrier - one of the largest movable flood barriers in the world-, and the Greenwich foot tunnel -a 370 m long structure under the river that connects the south of London with the Isle of Dogs-. Personnel from the Barrier explained technical and historical facts about it and Dr Diego Alonso conducted the tour to the tunnel.

Our annual **Christmas lunch** had to be cancelled due to the spread of the COVID variant Omicron, and it was not until the Spring that we returned to celebrate an **outdoor get-together**. With the spirit of bringing science outside the research institutions, we celebrated one of our **Science in the Pub** events dedicated to oceanic fauna: "Aliens among us: a peek at marine benthos' private life". Held at a Spanish *vermutería* in South London, marine biologist Dr Loreto Gestoso gave us a glimpse of the morphology and habits of animals that live close to the sea-bottom.

Plans 2022/2023

Near future plans include continuing to promote social interaction, as well as offering opportunities for career development. In September, we have organised a **cultural day trip to Guildford**, a historical town in the heart of Surrey, a county Southwest of London, in which we will learn about the history of England through its landscape and architecture. The following month, our Welcome Party will be preceded by a **Pitch your Research** session, in which our members are challenged to present their work in 5 minutes.

Events 2021/2022

Events 2021/2022

The Working Group of the Oxford Constituency has put forward a myriad of activities in the year 2021/22, ranging from social and networking events to seminars and roundtables, as well as tours and punting activities.

In September 2021, the Constituency's Welcome Event allowed old and new members to meet each other in person for the first time after COVID-19-related disruptions. Events 2021/2022

The SRUK/CERU North East constituency was formally established in December 2021, with the election of our first management team in January. Since then, the working group has organised events, and regular meetings. We may be 'rookies', but we brought SRUK/CERU to the North East to stay!

Our first in person event was a **Welcome Event** at the beginning of March, held in Northumbria University, followed by drinks at the City Tavern. 
ECONOMIC REPORT

SRUK/CERU is a private company limited-by-guarantee operating as a non-profit society. Over the last years, our Society has experienced a huge growth in the number of events and initiatives. Although we count with our SRUK/CERU membership fees, all our activities would not be possible without the additional economic support from external sources.

We report in this annual memory the full economic year of 2021, which starts in January and finishes in December 2021. During the year 2021, the SRUK/CERU Board of Directors presented several funding proposals and applied to specific calls to public and private institutions, and it is thanks to our supporters that SRUK/CERU has been able to develop an ambitious range of activities. Our main supporters were Fundación Banco Santander contributing 55 % to our income, and Fundación Ramón Areces contributing 10 %. We also had continuous support from Fundación Lilly and the Office for Cultural and Scientific Affairs (OCSA) of the Embassy of Spain in London. This year, we continued to have our own source of income from the administrative work we do for the OnTheMove biennial programme (2%) and our memberships (16%).

At SRUK/CERU, we continue operating with an efficient economic policy, that is, we try to make the most out of the income received. This year, we have begun to recover from the difficulties caused by the Covid-19 pandemic in 2020, although some events were still postponed to 2022 due to ongoing restrictions, such as the Emerging Talent Award Ceremony or the 2022 Annual Symposium sponsored by the Fundación Ramón Areces and Fundación Banco Santander. They will be celebrated in 2022 with the surplus budget from this 2021 year and will be included in the next annual report. We anticipate having a completed return to normal activities and expenditure by 2022.


