



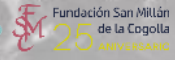

Social Perception of Science and Technology in Spain

Prof Moreno is a Professor of Journalism and member of the Institute on Social Welfare Policy (POLIBIENESTAR) at the University of Valencia. She is also a member of the advisory board of the Studies Centre on Science, Communication, and Society from the Pompeu Fabra University (CCS-UPF) and member of the Scientific Advisory Council of the GADEA for Science Foundation (GSF).

All of her works have had a significant impact on media due to her great interest to the transfer of the results of her research to society. At this point, she has been collaborating in the knowledge transfer with the Spanish Foundation for Science and Technology (FECYT), and with the Organization of Ibero-American States (OEI). Moreover, she has carried out research stays at international centres such as Cornell University (Ithaca, New York); the Austral University (Valdivia, Chile); the Quilmes University and the National University of Tres de Febrero (Argentina); and at Harvard University (Cambridge, Massachusetts).

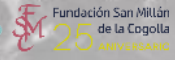
